Summary of Annual Meeting Dayton, September 13, 2019

Officers and other elected executive committee members will continue for the second year of their term. John Parliman will remain Newsletter/Facebook Editor and Historian. Jerry Martin will continue as Webmaster.

The By-Laws were amended as follows by unanimous vote: (1) the Webmaster, Newsletter Editor and Historian will be members of the executive committee and (2) the requirement of a 30 day notice prior to a proposed By-Law amendment was removed. Discussion on our future took place. Options for the future of the group were discussed including (1) affiliating with related Associations, (2) growing the membership and (3) developing a plan to meaningfully terminate the Association, when and if it becomes necessary.

Lowell Phillips discussed his project to create two albums – one of our original members, the other of reunions – to preserve the Association's history. A copy of each would be presented to the National P-38 Association for its museum at March AFB and a copy would be retained in the 82nd FGA's archives. Members are requested to send originals or copies of any FGA combat and reunion photos to Lowell.

It was discussed that we are now at a point where reunion and annual meeting attendance is not a given. Decisions for the survival of the Association can no longer wait for annual meeting votes. The membership unanimously voted to empower the Executive Committee to make decisions for the good of the Association without general membership vote in line with the options and concerns discussed at this meeting.

Discussion occurred on the need to keep 82 FG history alive. Bruce Loewenberg offered to compile 82nd documents with help. Everard Smith volunteered to help record the history of the group through videos from 82nd reunions, private videos, 8mm films, etc.

There are 82nd commemorative plaques similar to the one at Dayton at the USAF Academy and March AFB. There was unanimous approval to hold the 2020 reunion and rededication at the USAF Academy and at March AFB in 2021. The Parlimans and the Powells offered to host the 2020 reunion. A host volunteer is needed for 2020.

Bruce Loewenberg proposed having a speaker as a draw for the reunions. John Parliman asked why people attend our reunions – camaraderie or events & venues. He asked the group if they would support changes for reunions to smaller venues and less paid activities to lower costs to all. There was general agreement to this suggestion.
