



Slovak Partisan Honor Ceremony, 28 Aug., 2000 Lubina, Slovakia

From Bill Hayduk and George Bowers

Dear Hank and all the 82nd Members:

George Bowers and I just returned from a trip to Slovakia. We were guests of a flying group who are enthralled with the 15th Airforce and its history. Due to my being an evader and having been rescued by partisans, and George leading a supply drop escort to a partisan group, the history buffs found us. That's a short version of how and why we got to Slovakia. We were also there to pay homage to the partisans who lost their lives fighting to return downed American flyers to their bases. For three days we were escorted like royalty to various ceremonies where the Slovaks were honoring the people who rebelled against the Germans on August 28, 1944.

We met four men: Dr. Marion Hrodegh, Lt. Col. Jan Bogar, Herman Roman, and Jan Babincak. These four men know where every 15th Airforce plane shot down over Slovakia, landed. Dr. Marion Hrodegh went to Vienna, and purchased our 82nd Fighter Group history book and has practically memorized it. These men are terrific researchers. They are down to trying to get serial numbers of aircrafts. They showed us a piston from Lt. Allen's 95th P38 that was raised from a swamp in '91 or '92 outside Bratislova.

Before we departed from this group George and I were both presented with the golden pilots wings of the Slovak airforce. The enclosed picture shows Lt. Col. Jan Bogar presenting George with his wings. The presentation of the wings was ordered by Airforce General Stefan Gombik.

The picture that shows a large group of people carrying flowers was at one of the ceremonies George and I attended. The first row of people in the picture are the French Airforce's attaché group. The second two people are Colonel Bingham, our U.S. military attaché, and his interpreter. The next man is a Polish General, attaché for the Polish Government. The next three people are Mary Cemanova, in charge of taking care of American evaders. The man next to her is Ray Madsen, an evader who was flown out of Slovakia during a secret mission to bring anti tank supplies to the partisans and returning with 20 downed airmen. This is a story in itself. The girl next to Roy is Mimi Gosney, whose father was a news correspondent. He came in on that secret mission. He stayed and later was captured with a couple U.S. airmen and some partisans who then were executed in Mathousen, Austria. His name was Joseph Morton, and he is the only news correspondent known to have been executed. His daughter was born after he was executed. Immediately behind Roy and Mimi are Lt. Bogar, myself, George and Dr. Hrodegh. As the picture depicts this was a very solemn occasion.

The third picture speaks for itself. George and I having our beer before lunch at an outside cafe in Vienna. This could go on and on so I'll quit here and send some pictures for the following newsletter after this letter goes to press.

George and I would like to see Dr. Marion Hrodegh made an honorary 82nd Fighter Group member and to receive our newsletter. We will pay his lifetime membership dues and for the extra postage.




