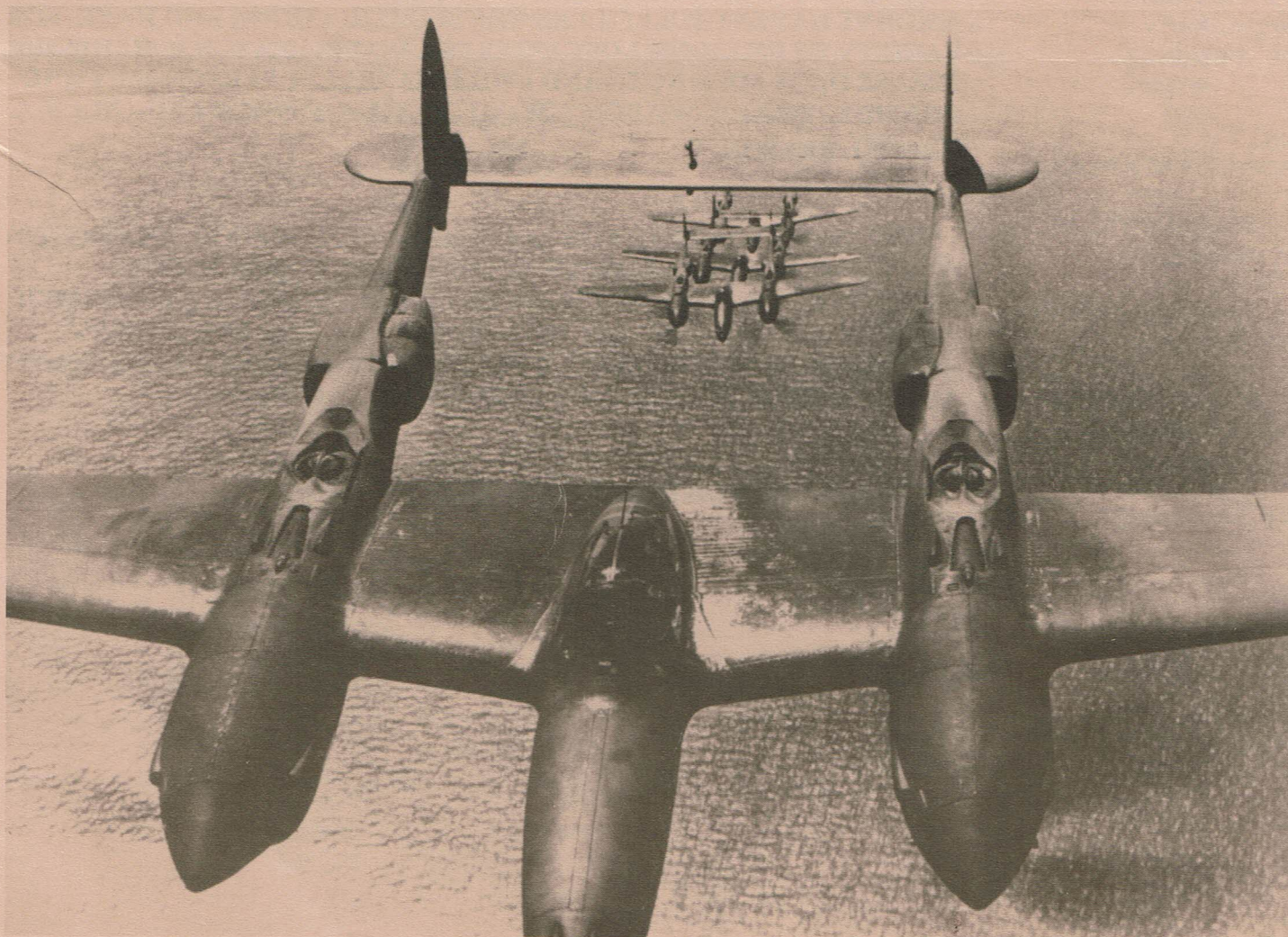

Hi again Hank -

I believe I sent you earlier some "new" information on the 82nd Group's first combat casualty, 2nd Lt. Earl Travis Green of the 95th Sq. Specifically, the fact that he was, in fact, killed in the Group's first combat, over the Bay of Biscay, on December 23, 1942. It HAD been reported that he survived the crash into the sea after his P-38 was shot down by the Ju 88, somehow made it to the coast of France and was then helped to evade capture with the help of the French Underground. We now know this was, in fact, not true. As I also told you previously, Irish aviation historian Martin Gleeson, who has done a lot of research on the Group's brief sojourn in his country, learned that Lt. Green's name is on "The Wall of the Missing" at Cambridge American Cemetery in England. Martin recently obtained a copy of Earl Green's Deceased Personnel File and found additional pertinent information therein, including a statement by Bob Kirtley, recorded in 1948, saying that he saw Green's P-38 hit the water and sink after being hit by the Ju 88.

As to the origin of the rumor that Green had survived and evaded capture, it was reported erroneously in May 1943 by a source in Lisbon, Portugal that he was interned there. His parents were informed of this, and Green's mother wrote to the War Department two months later asking for more information. However, the interned pilot turned out to be Buddy Strozier.

I think the members will be interested to learn these details of the 82nd Fighter Group's first combat fatality and hope you will print this letter in the newsletter. If any of Lt. Green's 95th Squadron mates has a photo of him I would like to borrow and copy it.

I vividly remember that mission. At the time, we were in the middle of the Bay of Biscay, flying on the deck under a 500ft. overcast. My flight was on the left, flying a line abreast formation which I insisted on. We could visually cross-cover.

The flight on the right, led by the group commander, Col. Covington, was flying a loose trail formation. Lt Green was tail end Charlie on this flight. Back of that was a lone A-20.

Only the 95th flight was armed. Covington elected to go unarmed, since the RAF insisted that they had never been intercepted in this area. The 95th was armed with 50 rounds of .50 cal. per gun. This put us in an overload condition, but I considered it prudent.

The first indication of trouble was a call that the A-20 was down. As I looked right, I saw Lt. Green's P-38 hit the water and sink. The JU-88 on his tail went into the overcast. The B-26 and Covington's flight hit the throttles and headed south. I broke hard right and entered the overcast with my wingman, Lt. Jones. The overcast was about 1,000 ft. thick. As we broke out on top, I was directly behind and in firing position behind a JU-88. My guns were hot and I fired a long burst (amounting to 50 rounds per gun). The right engine flamed, and parts were coming off. Jones and I followed him back into the overcast, and we saw him crash into the Bay and sink. We circled but saw no survivors. Lt. Brodhead also got a shot and claimed a JU-88. He had engine trouble, and returned towards England, but missed it and ended up in Ireland. The main gear of his aircraft is now in a pub near where Gleeson lives. He was eventually released and rejoined us in Africa, but he flew no missions.

I elected to proceed to Gibraltar, our planned destination. Jones prop ran away, and he was using lots of fuel. We flew on the deck at reduce throttle about 15 miles off the coast of Portugal. The plan was to put him on the beach (or other flat place) if his fuel ran too low. He luckily had enough. About 50 miles from Gib, the weather went CAVU, and we landed with a big sigh of relief.

Though out our combat, we used the line abreast, weaving, cross cover formation, which cut our losses.

Didn't know my memory was that good.

Regards to all you birdmen, and to the family of Lt. Green. Keep on weaving. Some SOB might be on YOUR tail!!!

Burial will follow at Bellevue Memorial Park in Ontario. Pierce Brothers Griffith Mortuary in Chino handled the arrangements.

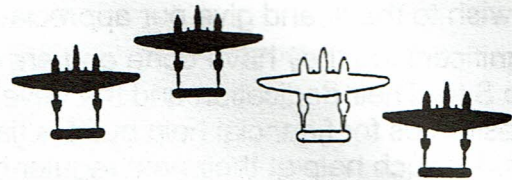


ANDERSEN

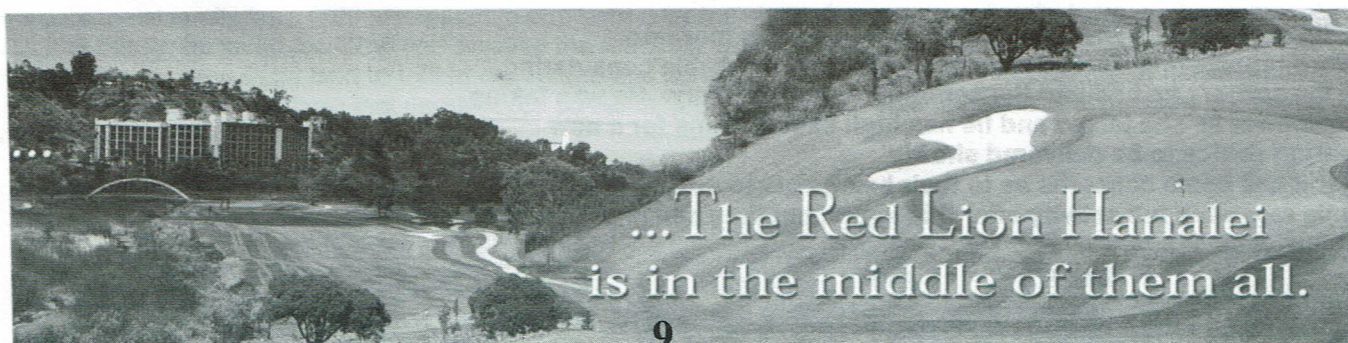
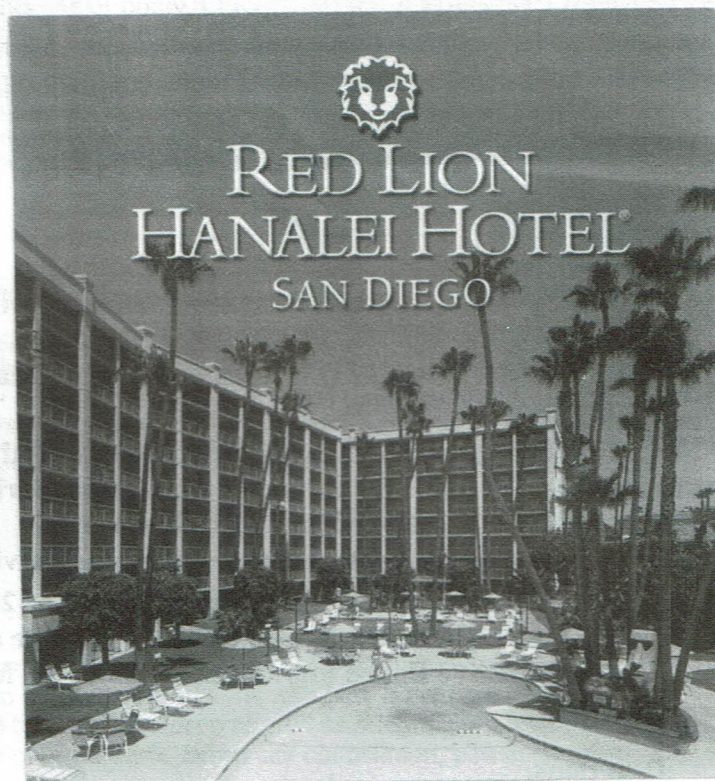
