

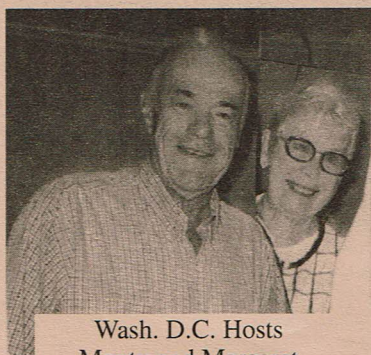

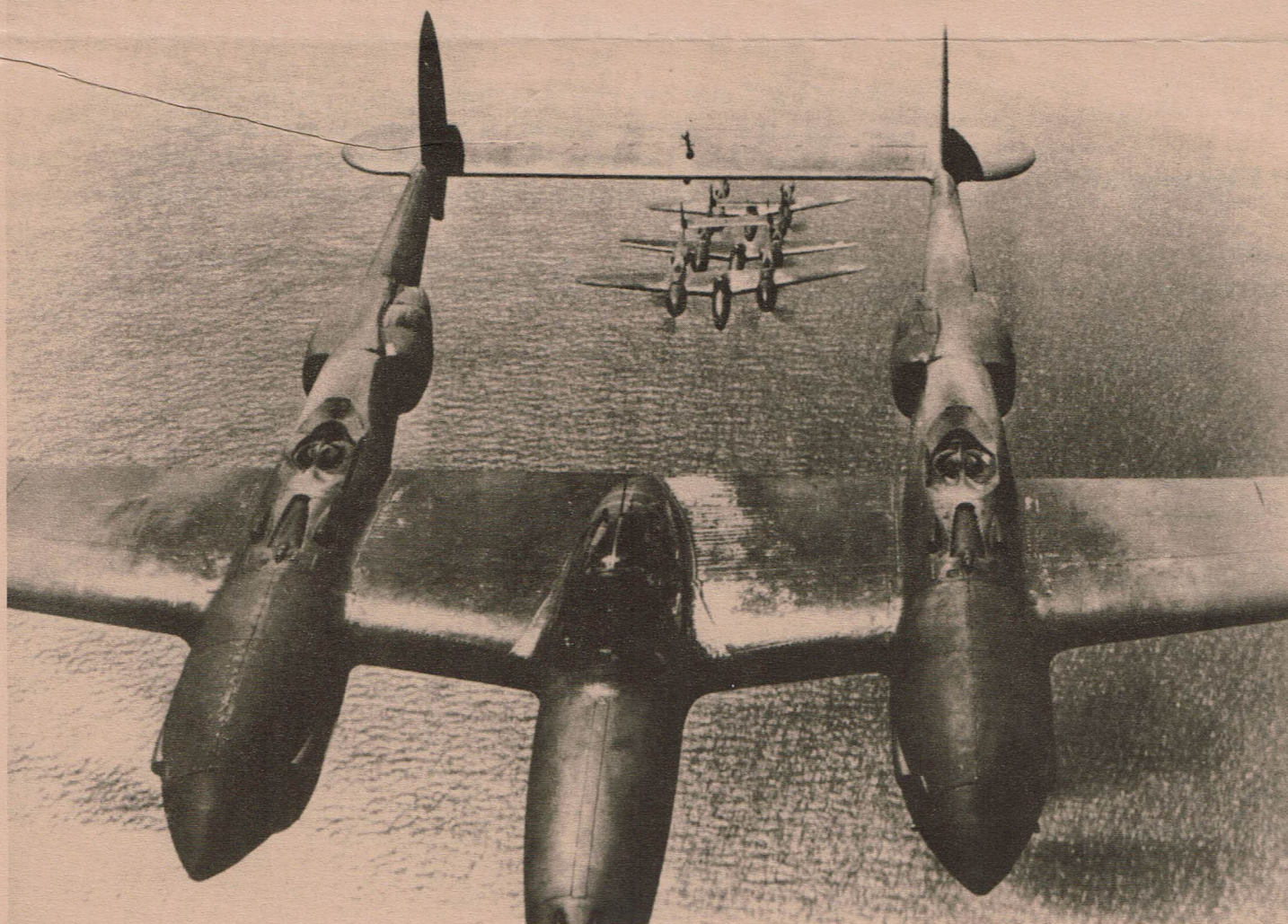

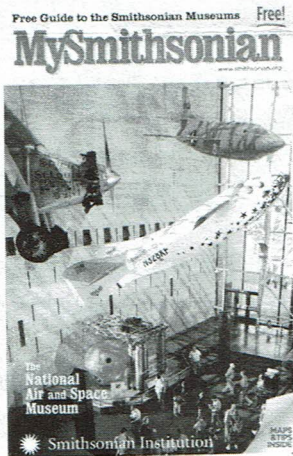
NO food or drink of any kind is allowed in the Museum.

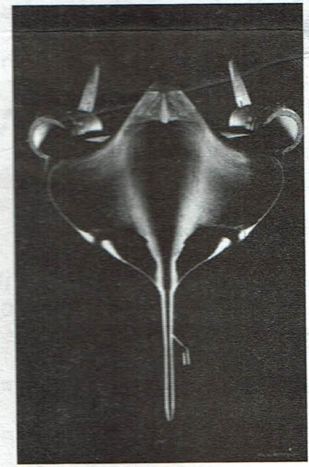

enjoyed them very much.

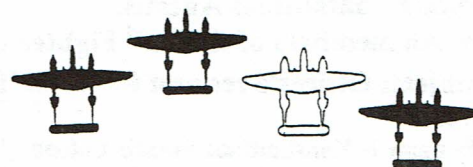
He will be greatly missed by

JOHN DAVID HELLER

March 8, 1922 - March 16, 2006

Lt Colonel (retired) John David Heller died peacefully at home on March 16, 2006 with his family at his bedside. He was born March 8, 1922 in Los Angeles, California to Charles and Isabelle Heller and is survived by his wife Rosalie of 62 years, children Ron Walters (Kayren) of Phoenix, AZ, Jack Heller (Jewell) of Panama City, FL and Deborah Heller-Evans (Randy) of Livermore, CA as well as 8 grandchildren and 13 great grandchildren.

Colonel Heller Retired from the United States Air Force in 1964 after serving his country for twenty-four years. During WWII he flew 52 combat missions in P-51's (52nd Fighter Group - 5th Squadron) and P-38's (82nd Fighter Squadron) in the European Theater of Operations (Italy). He was awarded the Distinguished Flying Cross, Air Medal with 6 oak leaf clusters as well as many other military accomplishments.

During WWII he flew P-39's, P-40's, P-47's, and P-61's. After WWII he went on to fly several military helicopters in Air/Sea rescue as well as the SA16 flying boat and B-25 Mitchell. Prior to his retirement in 1964 at Travis AFB, CA, Colonel Heller flew C-118's for eight years as a Command Instructor pilot at McChord AFB, Washington and Hickam AFB, Hawaii.

After retiring, his love of flying continued in helicopters for various private companies. With the purchase of a Ryan PT-22 open cockpit aerobatic plane, he enjoyed taking friends and family up for flights around Mt. Rainier and the Puget Sound area. Over the years, he set a fine example for all his loved ones.

Hi to all

My name is Konstantinos Anestis Colonel (Ret) of Greek Air force and I'm looking to find information for a P-38's Pilot most likely CPT Corning Clarence H The above gentleman most likely was shoot down on Oct the 8th 1943 over Greece Levadia in between Mountains of Helikon and Parnassos My Family (my Father at that time 15 years old) gathered from wreckage site a navigational case and death recognition case The incident happened very close by my born town Levadia Greece This is the 4th time that I try to get contact with that pilot (if he is the one) or his family in order to appreciate for what he have done during WW II for my country

My father believes that among the others still there are some wreckage from that P-38 who downed on Oct. 8th, 1943 You see that my grandfather my father and my uncle were watching the dog fighting and saw the parachute of the American pilot dropping down but unfortunately they could not manage to get the pilot first like the British one year earlier They heard that the German troops get him away if you have any question or information please contact me at the following Konstantinos Anestis 187 A Lexington St Watertown Ma USA 02472 Tel 978 996-1373 Cell

Hello Konstantinos,

Your message is most exciting and I have a few questions for you. Some of the questions may sound a little unusual and/or dumb. But, you don't know until you ask.

The 82nd Fighter Group lost 3 men that day.

#1 I think you have the wrong name. It's not Capt. Clarence 'Pop' Corning/HQ. Pop was in a B-25 as an observer on that mission. That B-25 was shot down and Pop became a POW. All those planes and he ends up getting shot down and becoming a POW.

#2 2nd Lt. Clayton M. Bennett/95th. He was captured and became a POW. He however, did escape later and evade recapture. I'm sorry to say, he passed away in 1985.

Which brings us to #3 and the pilot that your father, uncle, and grandfather were watching. This was most certainly 2nd Lt. James P. Shawver/95th - MIA/KIA. I'm not sure of his location/area, when he was lost. Any additional information from your family and/or anyone on this, would be greatly appreciated.

Now for my questions:

Is the wreckage site well known to a lot of people or kind of a secret site ? Is the wreckage above ground or below ground ? Any idea what is left of the 38 ? Does anyone have any photos and/or newspaper stories - from WW II or now ?

You mentioned a navigation case and a death recognition case. I assume that there were all kinds of papers and/or charts in these cases ? Is the intention to return these items to the 82nd FG and/or the pilot's family ? If not, would it be possible to get scans/copies of what paper items that may have been in the cases ? Is the crash site going to be excavated or left intact ?

Anything pertaining to this, is most important to the entire 82nd FG members and their families. Even after 60+ years, they remain a very close and tight Fighter Group. They still have the, "all for one and one for" attitude.

Needless to say, as soon as I can learn a little more, I'll probably have more questions.

I hope my questions have not seemed to abrupt or blunt.

Update from Terry: After a few phone calls with Konstantinos, it was also learned that his grandfather, father, and uncle watched the dogfight, watched the plane come down and crashed into 2 separate main pieces near them, and watched the pilot parachuting down with the wind carrying him into the enemy's hands. His family recovered the leather case which contained papers and/or maps and a 45 handgun. His grandmother destroyed all of the papers in fear of being caught with them. His father hid the leather case and the 45, in separate places. The 45 remains hidden and maybe lost forever, somewhere under a pile of rocks. *Luftwaffe* records indicate that it was Sergeant (*Feldwebel*) Heinz Bartels *, a top *Luftwaffe* Ace, who shot down Bennett and Shawver. Bartels was lost a few months later in combat action. AAF records officially show, 3 P-38's lost this day. In my communications with Steve Blake, to assist in record checking, the 3rd P-38 belonged to a 5th AF Group and went down near Madang, New Guinea. Needless to say, it is possible for anything to happen. Reference to the recovered leather case. Steve and I, think and assume, that the leather case came from the P-38 of 2nd Lt. James P. Shawver/95th. Communication with Konstantinos continues today, and YES, there is a lot more information to this story, as well as, countless other stories and information to relate.

They haggled around for a while trying to get handicapped, but they finally decided to shoot one round scratch for \$10.00, then adjust. Well, Curly broke every bird until each of the others had missed. Then he kept track and when everyone had at least two misses, he'd miss. So he won \$40.00, and they adjusted. Next round he broke all the birds and won \$40.00 more.

Curly told them he'd give them a chance to get their money back, if they gave him five birds he'd shoot left handed. ^{for a double} All he did was break 20 so he won \$80.00 more.

They never invited him to shoot for money again.

HE TAPPED ME LIGHTLY ON MY CHEST AND SAID "STUMPY—PAUSE— IF YOU DON'T GET THAT GEAR DOWN AMM GONNA KILL YA." HE WAS VERY STERN, AND UNSMILING.

OBVIOUSLY WE GOT THE GEAR DOWN BECAUSE I'M STILL HERE SURE would like to see Dixie again.
