

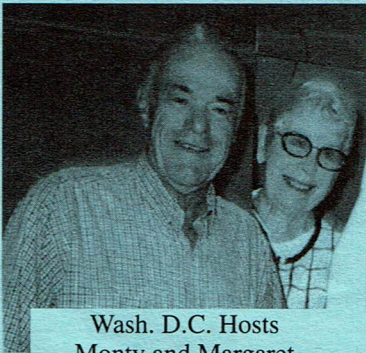

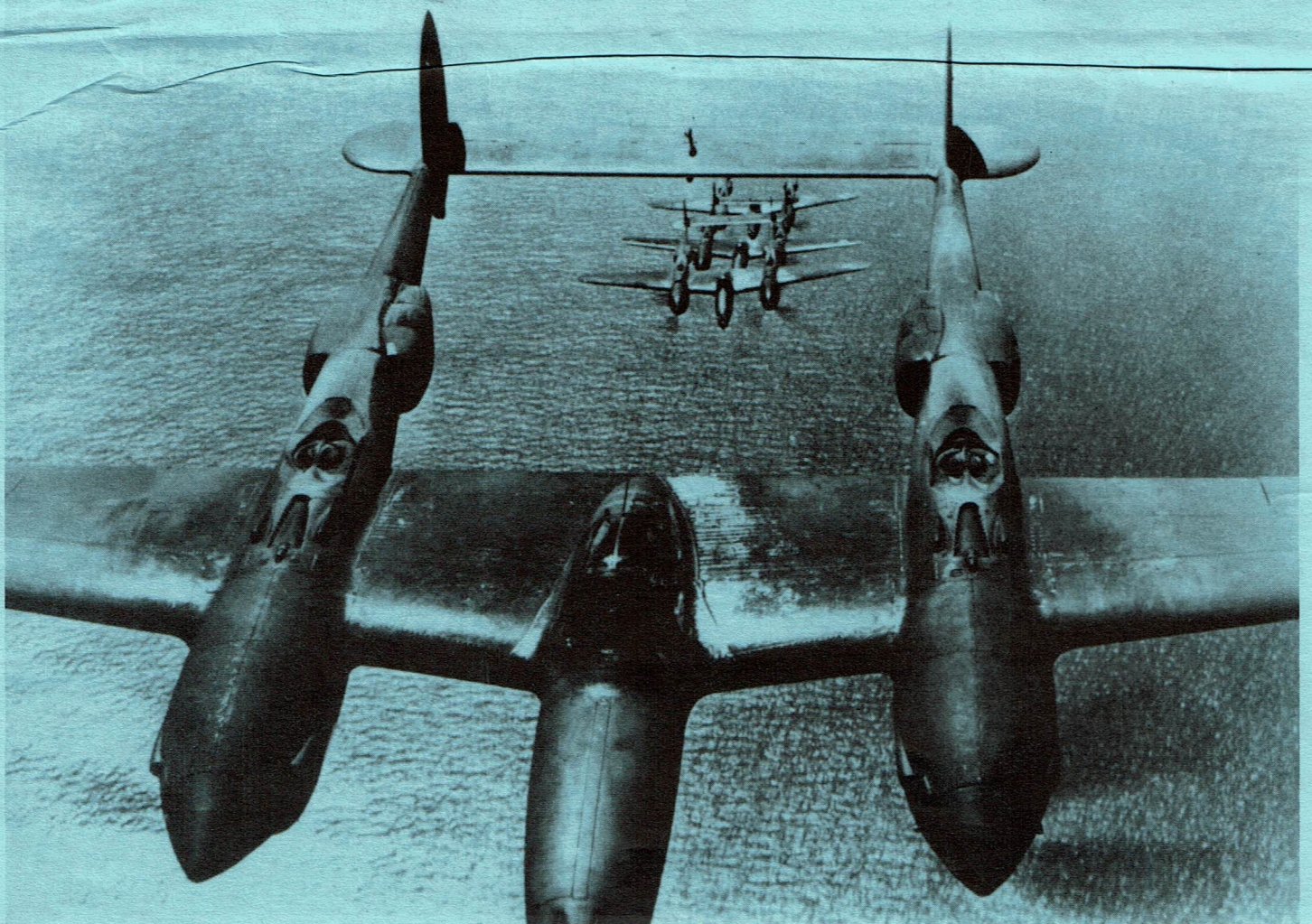

Hello Everyone,

At the end of October, visitors to the 82nd FG website totaled: 246,990. By the time you receive this NEWSLETTER, the 82nd FG website will have celebrated its 4th Anniversary, at the end of November and the visitors total will be well past: 250,000.

The idea 4 years ago, was that the 82nd FG website would be a tribute to the 82nd FG members. No one, had the slightest idea or thought, that it was going to be BIGGER than anyone could ever imagine. Everyday is a BIG surprise, still.

We continue to receive messages from other AAF family members needing help and assistance. In the past 2 weeks, we have heard from the family of a post WWII - 97th pilot; the family of a 3rd or 5th Recon Group ground crew member. And, a regular 82nd FG visitor, that had purchased some items belonging to, Charles 'REX' Langdon/95th. The items included: Air medal, DFC Medal, and an envelope of official paperwork. This gentleman purchased these items at an auction in Southern Indiana and has been kind enough to make copies of all the paperwork and has sent them to me.

We have also received communications from numerous 'new' 2nd & 3rd generation 82nd FG family members, who are also needing help, assistance, and looking for information for the following 82nd FG members: Charles R. Curran/95th - KIA 4/29/43; Charles W. Matthews/95th; Frank H. Henderson/96th - KIA 12/23/42; Walter L. Kroneberger, Jr./96th; Eddy E. Light/96th; Vernon 'Dixie' Walker/96th; George E. Wehman, Jr./96th - MIA 6/18/43; James H. Dean/97th; John Homan, Jr./97th - KIA - 10/18/43; Lawrence M. Jones/97th - POW 5/29/44; William A. Knell, Jr./97th - MIA 1/31/43; Lloyd F. Luddington/97th - MIA 1/24/43. If anyone can offer information, please contact me.

A few weeks ago, I received some photos of a 95th crash site, that is being excavated in Hungary. On 6/16/44, the 95th had 3 planes shot down. Bob Carpenter, Francis Hanlon, and Chelsa Roberts. Carpenter parachuted to safety but was captured and became a POW. Bob confirmed that as he floated down, he watched his plane crash into a winery building. The photos reveal that the excavation is not very far down from the ground surface. Hanlon's wing caught the ground, which probably caused a cartwheel/rolling crash. The Roberts crash, was, straight in. Thus, we believe the crash site to be that of Francis P. Hanlon.

On 10/8/43, the Anestis Family - Greek patriots, witnessed the dogfight and the shooting down of, James P. Shawver/95th. Konstantinos, Loukas, and Nikolaos watched helplessly, as the winds carried the parachuting Shawver into the enemy and thus ended any rescue attempt. The Anestis Family had rescued a British pilot, a months earlier. They did recover some items from the P-38 at the crash site. Shawver was listed as MIA. On that same day and mission, a few miles to the South, Clayton

Bennett/95th was shot down. He crashed/bellied landed into the Bay of Antikira. Bennett was thrown through the canopy on impact. He was able to inflate his dingy and paddled to shore. Bennett's intact P-38, slowly sank. He was hidden by the Greek patriots and would return to the 82nd FG a few months later.

At the DC Reunion, Col. Konstantinos Anestis, Retired Greek AF (named in honor of his grandfather) attended on Saturday evening and Sunday morning. While only there a few hours, Col. Kostas could feel the strong, close, and special emotions from the 82nd FG Family. Knowing now, that he and his family, are a part of the 82nd FG Family and its history.

Since the DC Reunion, Col. Kostas and I have communicated several times. He and his brother, Alexandros, who is a Major in the Greek AF, have started knocking on doors and calling Execs in the Greek AF, to recover, Bennett's P-38. The Greek AF has so far, recovered 5 planes from WW II, the latest being the first part of October. A Stuka, shot down by Maj. Levertte/37th on 10/9/43.

Col. Kostas is returning home to Greece for the Christmas/New Year's Holidays and has a very busy schedule planned. He, along with family members, and friends will meet with Greek AF officials about recovering Bennett's P-38, going to Bennett's crash site, and going to the Shawver crash site/area (again) to try and locate the remains of Shawver. Cousin, George Papageorgiou, has been talking with local citizens of the area where Bennett crashed and has located numerous people that remember and witnessed, Bennett crashing. This is in hopes of getting a more accurate location of Bennett's crash site for the recovery project.

Col. Kostas and I are thinking, that when he has the meeting with the Greek AF officials, and he can also hand deliver, letters of support to recover Bennett's plane from members of the 82nd FG, this will help to pursued the Greek AF to go ahead with the recovery project of Bennett's P-38.

Address your letters: Greek Air Force / Director of Underwater Recoveries. It doesn't have to be a long letter. It won't take long to write it. And it's only the cost of a stamp. Send your letter to me, by December 20th, and I will then send all of the letters to Col. Kostas.

I hope that all of the 82nd FG members will realize and understand how important this is. Of all the P-38's the 82nd FG had, we now have a chance to get one of them back. I will pass any and all updated information on, when I get it.

Cindy & I would like to THANK everyone that have purchased 82nd FG jackets and/or insignia patches. We greatly appreciate it. From the reports we are getting from around the country, the new 82nd FG jackets have been a 'hot' topic of conversation with our citizens. And, again, the 82nd FG is being remembered and talked about. If you would like a new 82nd FG jacket and/or insignia patches, please give us a call.

The DC Reunion was so exciting, words can't begin to tell it all. WHAT A WEEK!! Cindy & I had so much fun, being with everyone that could be there, and of course, missing the family members that couldn't be there.

Age 91, of Lewisville, TX, passed away Tuesday, June 20, 2006.

Mrs. Hoelzel was born November 29, 1914 to Earl Palmer Hill and Winnie Payne Hill in Newton, IL. She was a veteran of World War II and honorably served her country in the Army Nurses Corps where she achieved the rank of captain. She continued her career as a school nurse at the Ritchie Elementary School in Newport, DE for many years. She was also active in several social and fraternal organizations.

Her husband, Miles Vincent Hoelzel, preceded her in death in 1993. She is survived by her son, Miles Hoelzel and wife, Kathie, of Lewisville, TX and their children, Jeffrey Hoelzel and his wife, Jennifer; great grandsons, Jeffrey Hoelzel, Jr. of Tolleson, AZ and Kevin Hoelzel and his wife, Katy; great granddaughter, Bailey of Queen Creek, AZ; sister, Betty Crais of La Place, LA; and many other relatives and friends.

An internment will take place at Arlington National Cemetery, Arlington, VA, where her beloved husband, Miles, is also laid to rest, on Wednesday, July 19, 2006, at 11 am.

Young Kennedy



A little older

Peter Carleton Kennedy died of cancer on Aug. 2, 2006, at the UC Davis Medical Center. He was 83 years old.

He was born and raised in Berkeley, his family having come to California from Ireland when the potatoes failed. He entered UC Berkeley in 1941 and transferred to UC Davis in 1942. His hopes of becoming a veterinarian were interrupted by World War II, where he flew P-38s in Italy for the "Fighting 53rd," as he would say "flying low over Axis-held Europe."

Upon returning to the States he continued his education at Kansas State University where he met and married a classy Kansan, Irene Greer. After completing his veterinary degree at Kansas State, he accepted an internship at Angell Memorial Animal Hospital in Boston where he decided to become a veterinary pathologist. He earned his Ph.D. at Cornell University studying veterinary pathology under Peter Olafson.

In 1954 he returned to California to fill a position at the UC Davis Veterinary School where, with Don Cordy and Jack Moulton, he formed the fledgling veterinary pathology department, now one of the most admired and respected in the world.

PCK, as he affectionately became known, served for many years as chief of the pathology service at the Veterinary Medicine Teaching Hospital. His research focused on reproductive and fetal diseases, but he had a catholic interest in animal diseases. In 1963, he and Ken Jubb authored "Pathology of Domestic Animals," which has become the definitive text in veterinary pathology. "Jubb and Kennedy," as the book is generally known, continues to be the standard of excellence in the field and is now in its sixth edition.

Kennedy served as president of the American College of Veterinary Pathologists in 1969 and was selected as a distinguished member in 1989. He received the Distinguished Alumnus Award from Kansas State University College of Veterinary Medicine in 2000. He was also the author of more than 90 research publications and several book chapters.

Kennedy spent his professional life at UC Davis, but with the support of a Fulbright-Hays Fellowship, a Rockefeller Fellowship and numerous grants, he spent time, much of it with his family, in Canada, Australia, Argentina, Kenya and Norway. He "advanced to emeritus status" in 1992, but continued to attend the weekly biopsy conference.

He took advantage of what the university and Davis had to offer, raising four children: Kathleen, David, Doug and Annalisa, and celebrating 60 exceptional years of marriage to Irene. He continued to fly with the Flying Farmers and drove a Porsche 356. He learned tennis from neighbor Harley English and went on with Bob Dunning as his younger partner to win the Davis Doubles.

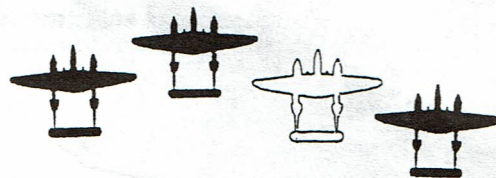
He introduced innumerable children and adults to the High Sierra with help from high country cattlemen friends. He taught many to appreciate fly-fishing, backpacking and mushroaming. He taught his kids to do kick-turns on "Chute 75," and he and his son, Doug, survived being buried in an avalanche on "Big Bee" while helicopter skiing in the Caribboos.

He was preceded in death by his son David.

He is survived by his wife, Irene; his brother, Kurt Kennedy; three children, Kathleen Kennedy, Doug Kennedy and Annalisa Deering; as well as five grandchildren and three great-grandchildren.

His most recent research work involved consulting for the Sea Otter Research and Conservation Program at the Monterey Bay Aquarium. A scientist throughout his life, he valued teaching and research to the end, offering himself up as a medical subject and telling veterinary stories to a half-dozen interns at the UC Medical Center hours before his death.
