

Obituary on: Jack Robert Duncan


CMSgt. Jack Robert Duncan, U.S. Air Force, Retired, age 90 of Schertz, passed away on November 6, 2007. He was born to John & Vera Duncan on March 15, 1917 in East Liverpool, Ohio, later moving to Youngstown, Ohio. Jack was the oldest of five children. After graduating from high school, he worked two years for the steel mill. Jack joined the Army Air Corps on September 7, 1940 later becoming a part of the U.S. Air Force. He was a P38 mechanic during World War II, serving in Italy, Ireland, Algeria, Tunisia, Russia and Sicily. After the war, he was a mechanics instructor for the P38 while at Chanute AFB, IL., residing in Mahomet, IL. from 1946-1966. As a veteran of three wars, Jack did duty in 21 European countries and participated in 11 campaigns. He finished his career at Randolph AFB Military Personnel Center. Jack retired after 33 years in the military achieving the rank of CMSgt.

Military awards and medals include: Meritorious Service, Air Force Commendation, Good Conduct (Army and Air Force), American Defense Service, American Campaign, European-African-Middle Eastern Campaign, World War II Victory, Korean Service, Vietnam Service, United Nations Service, Presidential Unit Citation, Air Force Outstanding Unit, Air Force Longevity Service, Small Arms Expert Marksmanship and Russian Commemorative Medal celebrating the 50<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the victory over Germany in WWII.

He enjoyed politics, serving as Republican Committee Chairman, served on the board of Schertz Senior Citizen Housing, a member of the Hanger Door, past member and commander of Mahomet Legion Post 1015, and Masons.

Jack is survived by son, Jack L. Duncan, Dallas; daughters, Pam Parker & husband, Steve, Mahomet, IL & Ellen White & husband, David, San Antonio; sister, Ellen Duncan, Pensacola, FL; grandchildren, Kathy Henderson & husband, Daryl, Rob Parker & wife, Kris, Jonathan White & Aaron White and great-grandchildren, Kami & Lawson Parker.

#### 82nd Fighter Group reunites, tours Sheppard

10/23/2007 - SHEPPARD AIR FORCE BASE, Texas — Members of the 82nd Fighter Group gathered in Texas for their 65-year reunion this week, and were welcomed at Sheppard Air Force Base Oct. 19.

"It was more than I ever expected, the whole base fell out to greet us," retired Lt. Col. John Kane, a tour member, said, echoing the sentiments of many there. "They were all very respectful of us, I was impressed. I don't know how you keep your Airmen so motivated, but the reception we received was very fine, very professional."

The war veterans spent the afternoon touring the 80th Flying Training Wing headquarters, trying their hands at the T-38 simulators, and viewing the planes along the flight line.

Some tour members were wives and children of the vets, accompanying the retirees on their trip down memory lane. One man, Dave Hanley, made the trip in his father's place.

"I found out about these reunions on Google," he said. Shortly thereafter he set about attending gathering after gathering of the group, hearing and telling tales of his father, former 2nd Lt. Elbert "Cotton" Creech.

He also told the story of how the Sheppard's 96th Flying Training Squadron got its patch emblem, a cartoon of a fighting rabbit.

"At Edwards AFB, back when it was called Muroc, the guys used to drive out at night in their jeeps and shoot jackrabbits, and that image stuck with them," he said.

For all the chatter amongst the tourists, the room fell respectfully silent when Bill Mason stood by the Heritage Center display showcasing the 1944 air strike over Ploesti, Romania, and spoke of his father's role in that historic air raid. But instead of downward-cast eyes at the memory of a brave pilot, admiring gazes were aimed at a wizened gentleman curled up in his wheelchair. Col. Ben Mason, former commander of the 82nd FG and the oldest living P-38 pilot at 94, listened to his son's words and remembered the day he and his P-38 "Billy Boy" spearheaded that battle.

"It was just a few days after D-Day," he said, recalling the dive-bombing mission in Romanian skies that cost Hitter his main diesel and gasoline supplies.

"Just another day at the office," he said.

Capt. Andre Lecours, 360th Training Squadron, and Maj. Eriik Nikula, 80th FTW, organized the tour.

"These inexperienced pilots were sent out against the German Luftwaffe, seasoned pilots with hundreds of combat hours. They had to learn quick and they did," Major Nikula said. "It's wonderful to have these guys here, they're real heroes. It's a real honor to have them with us; we live free because of their sacrifices."

The 82nd FG was renamed the 82nd Training Wing in 1993. Squadrons within the fighter group were the 95th, 96th and 97th Fighter Squadrons. The 96th and 97th FTS are currently assigned as Air Force Reserve Command flying training squadrons in the 340th Flying Training Group.

I flew a bomber escort mission on the 19th July, 1943, but all I have is the log book entry which does not give any details other than that it was a bomber escort and was of five hour duration.

I never saw a P-38 from any unit go down and strafe. That is a very interesting letter.

I hope that all is well with you these days. We are doing okay.

Verne's letter refers to the alleged strafing of Rome by P-38s on 19 July, 1943. The 82nd Fighter Group has asked for information from pilots who flew missions on this date.

Car 2 Flight Report....

The Drive from Hell....or, a Funny Thing Happened on the way home from the 82<sup>nd</sup> Reunion

The Hank Phillips "Team Mobile", consisting of H&M in Car 1, and the Fuereders/Faheys in Car2, set out from Dallas in great weather. However, the Mobile, AL region was another matter. Heavy rains greeted the Team (later reports would indicate a foot of rain fell over that region).
