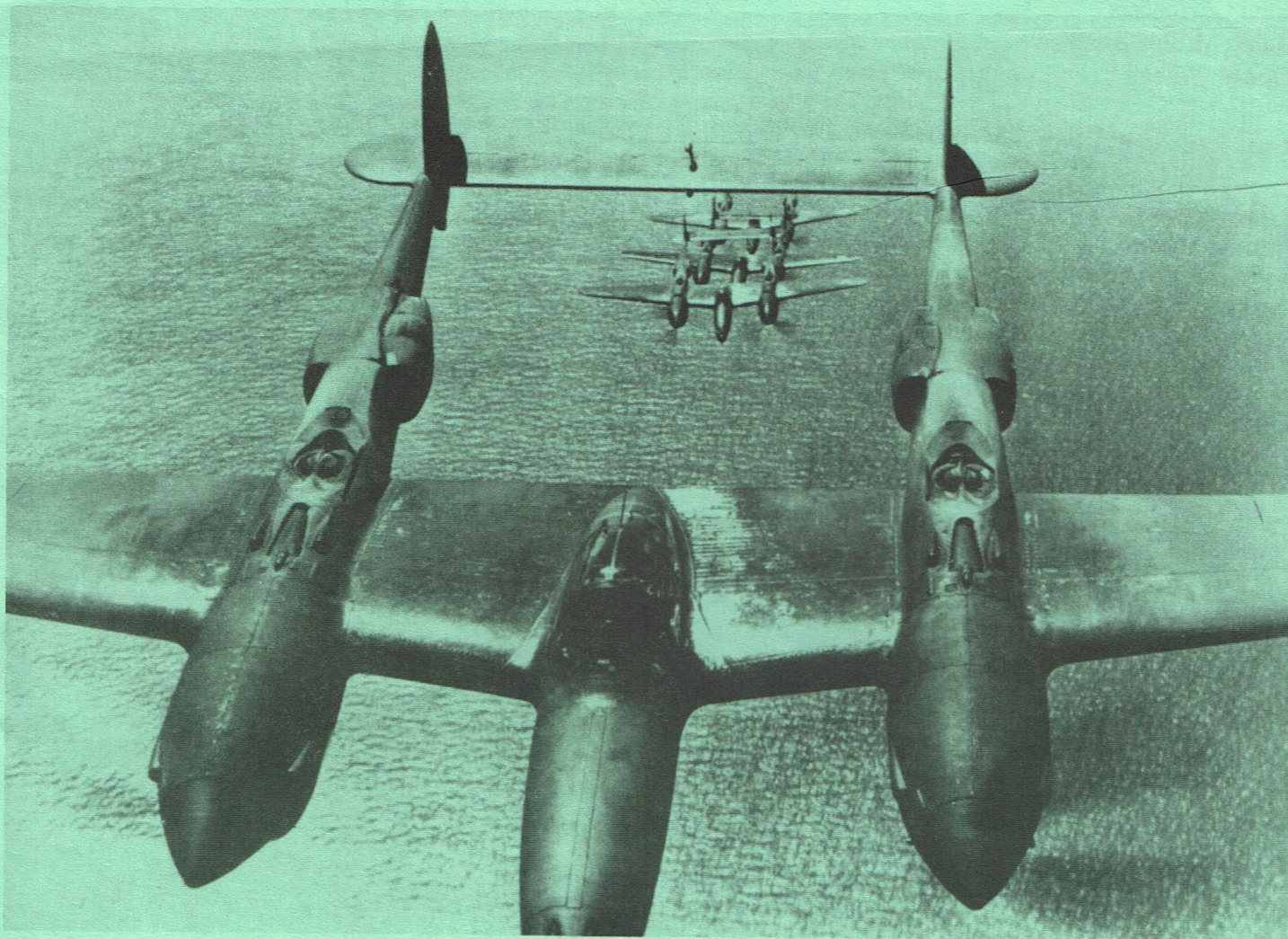

Hi Hank,

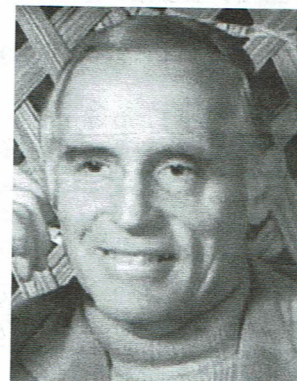
You might find use for the attached snapshot it was taken

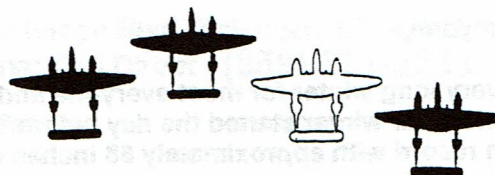

He was an original "Radio Flyer." Loving Jazz and Big Band music, Southern California beaches, motorcycles, boats and anything fast, he settled in the Hollywood Hills in the 1960's with his wife Phyllis in the house they built overlooking the Los Angeles he so dearly loved. It was a very long winter for most everyone and according to the calendar it is spring. But, winter conditions are still around. Our winter started the day before Thanksgiving with a 5 inch snow storm. We had the 10th snowiest winter on record with approximately 58 inches of snow.

By the time you receive this NEWSLETTER worldwide visitors to the 82nd FG website will be approximately 365,000. When I have the chance to spot check and confirm website statistics, the Educational Institutions that visit the website continue to increase and are now well past 300.

Anniversary and birthday wishes to everyone since the last NEWSLETTER. For those that didn't know. The 82nd FG's most experienced member is, Joseph 'DOC' Gerber/95th. Doc celebrated his 99th birthday back in Dec. Our second most experienced member is, Ben Mason. Ben celebrated his 96th birthday back in December as well.

Col. Wolf Asmus returned home the first week of March. Wolf sends his 'thanks and appreciation' to everyone for their thoughts, concern, and support for him and his family while he was deployed. Wolf says, "He and Brenda can hardly wait for the Cincinnati Reunion. And hopefully, Zach, Ben, and Maren will be there as well.

Olen Medley recently told me that the HMS Curacao, cut in half by the Queen Mary, had been located on the sea floor. I did some quick searching and communicated with one of the divers. Here is that communication: "Hey Terry, Myself and a few friends dived on the wreck of HMS Curacao at the end of last year. We dived the wreck of HMS Curacao on the 19th October 2007. The trip was organized by Norman Woods. A team of three divers made up of Norman, Stewart Andrews and myself dived the wreck in 125m approximately 55miles north off the Donegal coast. We did bring down a stills camera and HD video camera. Unfortunately we were unable to capture images from the wreck on this trip due to the depth of water. We had our HD video camera leak water and the stills camera jam due to the water pressure at 125m. We have located both sections of the cruiser but have only dived the bow section to date. It is completely inverted. We plan to go back this summer when the weather improves to dive the wreck further and to get some proper images of the wreck and to dive the stern section. I have copied Norman into this email also as he might be able to give you further information on a documentary that is planned on the sinking of the wreck which we hope to capture images for this summer. I have attached a copy of the trip report wrote by Stewart after the trip. It is only a quick note that was posted on an Internet forum in Ireland relating to technical diving. I hope this information is useful to you. Best Regards, Barry McGill, Ireland."
