

82nd Fighter Group Association Annual Meeting at Cincinnati Reunion Erlanger, Kentucky Airport Holiday Inn October 4, 2008

Meeting came to order at approximately 8:45AM.

Present for the Executive Committee: John Kane, President; Richard Ostronik, Vice President; Don Foley, Past President; Ben Mason, Headquarters Representative; Olen Medley, 95th FS Representative; Dick Gadbury, 97th FS Representative. Original members also present were Will Hattendorf, Monty Powers, Hank Phillips, George Rivest, Charlie Pinson, Roy Norris, Mac McAdams, Bob Carpenter, Leo Fisher, Jim Monyhan, Del Ryland and Howard Warne.

John Kane called the meeting to order and, after the Pledge of Allegiance, mentioned that veterans may now salute the flag per a recent congressional change and that this would be the protocol at future meetings. John requested that John Parliman, Secretary-Treasurer, read the proposed amendment changes (attached). Will Hattendorf commented that the provision for dissolution of the organization was, by putting 82nd funds under the administration of a bank trust officer, proper. Dick Ostronik moved to accept the changes. Olen Medley seconded the motion. Ben Mason commented that allowing the second generation to become active, voting members was a good idea. Monty Powers commended the Massicks and the Executive Committee for their hard work. The vote to accept the changes was unanimous.

Discussion changed to the site of the next reunion with the recommendations being San Antonio, Kansas City, Scottsdale and Las Vegas. Las Vegas in mid-October of 2009 won the vote.

John Parliman mentioned he has found the company that makes the flags for the 95th FS at Tyndall AFB and that he will coordinate an order for anyone who wants a flag for the 82nd or any of its squadrons.

Don Foley requested that members donate to support the website.

Terry Massick commented on website visitor statistics. Since its inception in 2002, there have been over 406,000 visitors, averaging about 70,000 per year and representing 280 military institutions, 468 corporations and 401 education facilities. He also commented that a \$1,500 microfilm copier had been purchased for the History DVD project that has already been paid for by advance sales of the DVD.

Dick Ostronik mentioned that Linc Jones wife is ill. They couldn't attend the reunion but sent their regards to the 82nd.

Bob Priest mentioned that Al Graham requested pictures be taken of all the 82nd WWII vets present at all future meetings.

Olen Medley mentioned the National Geographic channel will air the documentary on the Queen Mary collision after January 1, 2009.

Fran Kane asked if John Parliman had been voted in as Secretary-Treasurer and the Executive Committee said he had been appointed. John Parliman mentioned he has a letter of appointment.

Hank Phillips moved to adjourn. Will Hattendorf seconded the motion. Meeting adjourned at 10AM.

Aido Anthony Buonaguidi - Obituary

Aido Anthony Buonaguidi - Passed away peacefully on August 18, 2008 after celebrating life in peak health for 83 years. Born in 1924 in Los Angeles, he attended local schools and graduated from Manual Arts High School. As a First Lieutenant in the Army Air Corps during WWII, he was a P-38 pilot at age 19. He received a Bachelor of Arts Degree from Occidental College and a Masters Degree in Secondary Administration.

"Mr. B" touched many lives as a gifted educator and winning Water Polo Coach at Glendale High School where he taught for 45 years. He was the Chairman of the Mathematics Department (20 years), Founder/Director of Snow and Water Ski Clubs, Director of the Pep Club, and, notably, the Director of "Glendale Educational Tours" who led busloads of high school students on 6-week tours around the United States from 1953-1972. He spoke fluent Italian and delighted friends and family with his music (singing, guitar, accordion, ukulele, piano, banjo), his whimsical poetry and art, his cooking, sense of humor and spirit of adventure.

He is survived by his loving brother, Frank (Lido) Buonaguidi, four children - Cheri, Judith, Marc and Matthew Buonaguidi, two grandchildren Darren and Chelsea Buonaguidi, former wife Barbara Nielsen, and the extended family, friends, colleagues and golf buddies who loved him.

The arrival of the newsletter jolted me to check my "draft" e-mail box and discover that a note I prepared months ago was still sitting there. Disrupted by haste and dampened by sadness, I had started, but did not finish and send my notice to you that my father died in late March—the 25th—after a difficult year and a tough winter. Indeed, as the tree outside his window began to leaf in the warming early Spring sun, for Dad it just remained winter and he died of pneumonia and congestive heart failure very early on March 25. He was 99 and 1/4, heading toward the century mark he coveted. In his two-room apartment were models and picture books of the P-38.

His medals from the 3 1/2 years he served overseas are in storage along with those models and books through which he looked with bright-eyed memories and pursed lips as he recalled good times and tough times with young men doing their duty.

Dad was on the Queen Mary that fateful trip and ran topside, he told us, as he felt the shudder and then the quick acceleration of the ship after the collision with the British escort. He saw the two parts of that ship as the Queen Mary moved away, not knowing if there were any enemy in the area.

I am asking my brother for a copy of the brief biography we prepared about Dad, mainly for the family. I'll send it to you. Perhaps you can send a notice to the 82nd Fighter Group and put something in the next Newsletter for posterity. I'm sorry I missed this one, with that historic event of which Dad was a part.

I don't know if Dad kept up his dues as things became more difficult for him. Because of his affection for the 82nd. I want to be sure his dues for this year are paid. Please let me know.

Again, I apologize for this late notice.

- 4. "'A' for Associate Members", this classification of members, continues to be reserved for: anyone who is interested in, helps to promote, and supports the 82nd Fighter Group Association on a regular basis. A \$10.00 yearly donation is requested to help with printing costs, payable to the Sec/Trea. No voting rights.

What do these very important and historic changes to the 82nd FG Association By-Laws mean?

When the original members of 82nd FG formed the Association, they had no idea how long the Association would

last. They assumed the day would come when there would be no more Reunions, interest in the 82nd FG Association would go by the wayside, and the Association would be dissolved. This is a fact for many military associations today. Several military associations have already disbanded and dissolved.

The original 82nd FG members did not think of or even dream that, The Kids and The Relatives (Family Members) of the original members; the men and women of the Air Force that have been, are currently in, and who will be serving in the future in the lineage units of the 95th, 96th, 97th Fighter Squadrons and the 82nd FG, which is the 82nd Training Wing today (Honorary Members) and people from around the US and the world that continue to care about, promote, and support the 82nd FG Association (Associate Members), "Would come forward and want to continue to carry the banner of the patriotic, proud, and humble members of the highly decorated, 82nd Fighter Group, for generations to come."
