

The 2010 82nd FG Reunion will be Oct. 13th - 16th in San Antonio, TX. The St. Anthony Hotel has been chosen as our Reunion hotel headquarters. The St. Anthony Hotel is the most historic hotel in Texas. The hotel recently underwent an 8 million dollar renovation, which was completed at the end of 2008. The 82nd FG Reunion 'Special Hotel' rate is \$99.00 per night plus tax. This rate will be good 3 days before and after the Reunion dates.

For those driving to the San Antonio Reunion, please go to the Rand McNally website for driving directions from your location to The St. Anthony Hotel: http://www.randmcnally.com. The St. Anthony Hotel is located between: I-35 & I-37 at 300 East Travis Street.

The St. Anthony Hotel has graciously waived the daily 'Parking Fee'. In The St. Anthony Hotel advertising and promotion media and venues, it is stated that the Hotel is 'on' The River Walk. In reality, it is approx. 1 & 1/2 blocks / 570 feet, from the Hotel. Shopping adventures are countless / numerous. There is a downtown trolley system, similar to the one in San Diego.

Reunion activities include: Golf is on Wednesday. If you have any golf questions, please call John Netzer Parliman or Will Hattendorf. Wednesday evening is open. Thursday will be the tour to Randolph AFB, with lunch at the Randolph Officer's Club. Thursday night will be the Pizza Party. Friday will be the trip to Fredericksburg, TX. to visit the Pacific Theater WW II Museum. There are approx. 5 aircraft located at the Museum which include a: B-25; TBM Avenger; F4 Wildcat; Japanese Val; Japanese Rex Float Plane. Lunch will be at the Airport Diner / Hanger Hotel, located approx. 4 miles from the WW II Museum. Friday evening is open. Saturday morning will be the annual Business Meeting. After lunch, there will be a 'FREE' tour (walking) to The Alamo, located approximately 3 blocks / 1267.2 ft / .24 miles from the Hotel. Saturday night activities start with the Cocktail Hour followed by the Banquet.

This year, something 'Special' has been added for Sunday and Monday after the official Reunion dates. Late last January, Lt. Col. John 'Skeet' Lindsey, C.O. of the 96th FTS, officially invited everyone attending the 82nd FG Reunion to come down to Laughlin AFB at Del Rio, TX, for a visit. For those wanting to go, we will leave at Noon, Sunday Oct. 17th. On Monday, immediately after lunch at the Officer's Club, we will return to The St. Anthony hotel in San Antonio, around mid afternoon Oct. 18th. The trip time is approximately 2 hours there and back.

Conversations with Lt. Col. Lindsey, Lt. Col. Todd Felton (a future 3 yr veteran of our 82nd FG Reunions), Maj. Brian Moles, and I, ironed out a tentative schedule of activities for the special visit. There are a number of 96th FTS members that I haven't talked with, but, I have been told that they are working on details pertaining to the 82nd FG visit and activities.

We will leave The St. Anthony hotel around 11:30 - Noon on Sunday Oct. 17th. It's about a 2 hour drive down and back. Sunday Laughlin AFB activities will include: Recovering planes from the weekend training missions; control tower tour; evening BBQ at the base family campground. We will stay on base overnight at the Laughlin Manor Hotel, a beautiful hotel. Room rates will be \$39 for 1 Queen Bed and \$52 for 2 Queen Beds. Include your Laughlin motel room amount on the Registration Form and your check. I will take care of making your Laughlin room reservation. The 96th FTS members are working on getting a P-17 Stearman, PT-19, and a P-51 to fly in for some walk a rounds and close up inspections, either Sunday afternoon/early evening or Monday morning. Monday morning Oct 18th there will be a breakfast; flight simulators; a question and answer session for a large number of 96th FTS members; lunch at the Laughlin Officer's Club with 96th FTS members; we will depart for The St. Anthony Hotel in San Antonio, immediately after lunch or no later than 1:30 pm.



Louis E. Pape

Louis E. Pape was born on Feb. 7, 1921 in Kirkwood, Ill., the son of Jessie Cardiff and Earl B. Pape, and passed from this life on Thursday, Feb. 18, 2010 at the age of 89. He was educated in Warren County schools and graduated from Kirkwood High School.

He studied electrical engineering at Bradley University in Peorla, Ill. He enlisted in the Army Air Corps and flew P38s during the North African Campaign, He was shot down on his 48th mission and spent the remainder of the war in Prisoner of War Camp.

Pollowing the war, he returned to the family farm in Warren County, Ill., and farmed for 48 years, retiring in 1997 to New Braunfels, a place they had become very attached to while being Win-

ter Texans.

He married Virginia Shaw of Monmouth, Ill., on Dec. 24, 1942 in Philadelphia, Pa. To this union was born a daughter Cheryl (David) Denslow of Parker, Colo. There are two grandsons, Andrew (Alet) Denslow of Porsgrunn, Norway, and Todd (Rachel) Denslow of Bloomington, Ill., as well as three great-grandchildren, Abby, Marcus and Megan Denslow. Captain Richard "Dick" Curran, 78, passed away Saturday, Jan. 2, 2010, after a massive stroke. Arrangements are under the direction of Dannel Funeral Home. Funeral services will be held at 1 p.m. Wednesday, Jan. 6, at St. Stephen's Episcopal Church with the Reverend Martin Yost officiating. Family visitation will be held at the funeral home Tuesday evening from 6 to 8 p.m. A reception will be held following the church services.

Dick was born at home on Dec. 6, 1931 in Pratt, Kansas. In his early years, he boarded at a private military academy prior to completing a degree in Petroleum Engineering from the University of Oklahoma, earning a Phi Beta Kappa key. He served his country proudly as a 1st Lieutenant in the U.S. Air Force as a member of the 95th Fighter Interceptor Squadron. During his service in the Air Force, he was assigned to Perrin Field and also Andrews Air Force Base. flying the F-86, F-105, and the A-6.

Upon his retirement from the Air Force, Dick became a pilot for American Airlines and attained the rank of Captain. Thereafter, he was known throughout the community as "Captain," and his proudest achievement was to pilot every type of plane in the American fleet.





I'm in San Antonio on a business trip. After work I walked a few blocks and saw the Alamo for the first time. Built in 1724 as a Spanish mission, the Alamo ("cottonwoods" in Spanish) became a symbol of courage in the face of overwhelming odds as a small band of Texas and Tejano volunteers defended their position against Mexican General Santa Anna and his troops during the Texas Revolution of 1835-6. Unfortunately, taking photographs inside the Alamo is prohibited. Too bad, its a very profound experience.
