



#### SECRETARY AND TREASURER REPORT

#### **Memorial Fund**

A fund has been established to build a memorial to the original WWII 82<sup>nd</sup> FG members at March Field where the unit initially trained and deployed to England. This is the brainchild of Leo Fisher (96<sup>th</sup>) who made the motion at the annual meeting in San Antonio and backed it with a starting donation of \$1000. Donations are tax deductible and will be acknowledged by a letter of appreciation indicating that. Updates will follow in later newsletter issues.

#### **Annual Membership Dues**

CHECK YOUR MAILING LABEL. The upper right hand corner has a 3 digit code that indicates if your dues are current. 'C'indicates current/paid and 'D' indicates due/owed followed by the amount paid or due. For instance C20 means you are current and paid \$20. D15 means you are not current and owe \$15. Dues are owed as of April 1 of each year and are optional for WWII members and their spouses, though the revenue is very much needed and appreciated.

#### **Reunion Net**

The San Antonio reunion net will not be tallied until the November bank statement has been received. Reunion attendees generously donated pre-paid fees from the cancelled Randolph AFB trip totaling \$671 which was applied to reunion expenses.






